



Planning Your Gift....

Many people like you give faithfully to churches and charities on a regular basis. reSource Leadership International depends on such gifts for its ministry of resourcing sustainable theological education in the developing world.

Other types of giving that help to provide stable, long-term support are gifts from accumulated assets such as will bequests, life insurance proceeds, endowment funds and gifts of property or securities. You might also consider establishing a family foundation. These types of gifts may be facilitated through Mennonite Foundation of Canada with careful planning to ensure the greatest benefit to the giver and the receiver.

Charitable Gift Planning

Will Bequests

A bequest to charity through your will could be a last act of stewardship. A charitable bequest can reduce income tax payable on the final return up to 100 percent.

Property and Securities

By making a gift of capital property or securities to charity, you may be able to eliminate up to 100 percent of the capital gains taxes and recapture of depreciation...and so increase the amount of your gift.

Endowment Funds

An endowment fund allows you to provide ongoing support for many years, even beyond your death. Endowment funds can be established now or through a bequest.

Trust Deposits

Your available capital can be used for charitable purposes. The capital is invested and the earnings can be directed to charity. The capital can be donated or returned to you or your estate.

Life Insurance

A gift of paid-up life insurance guarantees your gift to charity at your death. Non paid-up life insurance may also be donated. Cash values and on-going premium payments for donated life insurance policies are receiptable.

Beneficiary Designations

You may designate charity as a beneficiary or alternate beneficiary of your RRSP/RRIF or life insurance policy. These gifts are receiptable.

Note: Consider these types of gifts carefully because of the needs of your dependents or tax implications. You should consult your financial advisor before finalizing a planned gift.

Cheques should be made payable to reSource Leadership International, designated to the reSource Foundation. All reSource Foundation funds will be held by Mennonite Foundation of Canada.
